Summer Project: The Board discussed an "Art Squared" art show and sale suggested by Claudia Smith, which she has participated in and found exciting. In the event we decide to pursue this idea, we will begin with using TWO small paintings as our Summer Project to be judged at our October all membership meeting. We thought it would be good to make the available paintings harmonious in color and subject matter to make it better for people to put together a grouping of the small paintings if they wish. It was suggested a Southwest Ancient and/or Modern Theme would cover a large area of ideas for the artists to utilize. It was decided to have black backgrounds using gallery wrapped canvas or cradled board that the sides are painted black or, build your own cradle board that equals 6" x 6" x 1 1/2 deep. Bright Colors used in the paintings. Since this will be the summer project, the paintings will be judged as a pair and the winning artist would win the \$100 prize money. The potential is that all of the paintings submitted for the summer project in October would eventually culminate in our first Art Squared event at a yet unspecified date.


